## Immunization Regulation Newsletter

Public Health Act - Immunization Regulation

Happy New Year Health Practitioners

**As a summary,** in December, 2018 the Alberta government introduced requirements to standardize practices for all immunization providers, regardless of whether a vaccine is provincially funded or privately purchased. As of December 17, 2018:

- Health practitioners shall ensure that adverse events following immunization are reported to Alberta Health Services within 3 days of becoming aware.
- The Regulation also sets out requirements for the storage, handling and transportation of vaccines

**As of January 1, 2021**, this Regulation will require health practitioners to ensure a report respecting immunizations and assessments is electronically submitted to Alberta Health within 7 days. Of note, retroactive reporting will be accepted but is not required unless a new immunization assessment is completed.

One of the options that Alberta Health is working on is a standalone mechanism that will facilitate the electronic submission of the immunization and assessment event information from health practitioners to the provincial immunization repository (Imm/ARI) through a web browser (web application). Alberta Health will be testing the web application and is looking for volunteers who provide immunization services year-round, to help evaluate the web application.
