
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Alberta Netcare Portal Enhancement

1. "My Details" Notification Email Description Updated

Description:	After consultation with eHealth the message on the "My Details" page for email notifications is modified.
Details	<p>Updated My Details description now includes the term: "ANP Outage notifications."</p> <p>The "My Details" Notification Email Address description now reads:</p> <p>"Please enter a regularly accessed email address. This address is used for ANP Outage notifications, eReferral updates, Provider Notifications and as an alternate for remote access expiry notifications. Changes to this field may take up to one hour to process."</p>
