

This quick reference provides instructions on navigating the Medication Profile in Alberta Netcare Portal (ANP).


Medication Profile Overview

The Medication Profile in ANP provides a view-only report of a patient's drug summary, or a detailed listing of medications for a specified number of months. It includes a list of prescriptions, dispenses, other medications plus a list of known allergies and intolerances.

The Medication Profile functions as an alternative to the **Print Profile with History Report** function in the Pharmaceutical Information Network (PIN) application. To learn more about PIN, visit the [Alberta Netcare Learning Centre](#).

How to Access the Medication Profile

- 1 Search for a patient in ANP, then open their record.
- 2 Click **Medication Profile** under **Limited Documents**, **All Documents**, or **Medications**.



How to Navigate the Medication Profile Viewer

Updating Medication Profile Search Criteria

- 1 Within the **Medication Profile Search** box, select the desired timeframe and report type.
- 2 Click **Search**.

Medication Profile Search

Include prescriptions created or dispensed in the past:

Summary Report Detailed Report

Please note that performance may be affected if the patient has a large number of medication dispenses.

NOTE

The default timeframe is 6 months. The default report type is **Summary Report**, which displays the last dispense date for each medication. For a detailed list of dispense dates, click **Detailed Report**.



Legend

1 Demographic information	Patient demographic information, including Personal Health Number (PHN), name, date of birth, and gender
2 Allergy information	List of known drug/non-drug allergy and intolerance information. ANP users manually enter the allergies and intolerances in the Medication Profile through the PIN application or via their vendor system.
3 Medication information	List of prescriptions and dispensed medications in chronological order. Under each medication name the dose and prescription/dispense details are listed.
4 Last dispense date	The last dispense date for a medication is displayed in the Summary Report . For a detailed list of dispense dates, select Detailed Report in the search criteria.
5 Prescriber information	Name of the clinician who prescribed the medication
6 Pharmacy Information	Name of the pharmacy that dispensed the medication

	Indicates data uploaded from a pharmacy batch (manual dispense information submitted by pharmacies).
	Information derived from dispense data submitted by Alberta Cancer Board outpatient pharmacies. Only includes dispensing information. Note: This information is only available for historical data prior to November 2022. Oncology medication information after this date can be found in the Consultations folder of the CDV.
No Icon	Prescriptions with no icon were created within PIN or through pharmacies/clinics using Real-Time Integration (RTI).
	A hard copy of the report can be printed.
	If medication data is incorrect, a data inquiry message can be sent to the Medication Profile Data Integrity team.

Multiple Unique Lifetime Identifiers (ULIs)

If a patient has more than one ULI, the list of ULIs will be displayed in the search criteria section so a ULI can be selected prior to running the Medication Profile report request.

When a patient has been assigned more than one ULI, the ULIs are merged into a primary/secondary relationship. Alberta Health determines the active/current ULI, which is considered the primary ULI. Non-active ULI(s) are considered secondary ULI(s). Currently, each type must be accessed separately.

Allergies, Intolerances, and Medications/Dispenses for Secondary ULIs

These are *only* available in the Medication Profile and cannot be accessed in the PIN application. Users accessing PIN for patients with multiple ULIs will be presented with a choice of continuing to PIN using the primary ULI or using the Medication Profile to view information stored for a secondary ULI.



Oncology Medication Information

Historical adult oncology medication data prior to November 2022 is viewable in the ANP Medication Profile and PIN application. After this date, adult oncology medication information will be found in the **Consultations** folder within the ANP CDV.

- Adult oncology medication information (both infusion and outpatient oral medication orders) is now found in the **oncology consult letters** under Consultations.
- Pediatric information remains in **consult letters** (no change).
