

Appropriate Use of Alberta Netcare

Guidance for Authorized Custodians

Authorized custodians and their affiliates may only access an individual's Netcare record if:

- They provide or have provided a health service to the individual, and
- The access is required for an authorized purpose under the Health Information Act (HIA)

Access must comply with professional scopes of practice and standards or requirements imposed by a regulatory college, or custodian/employer. Any access outside these requirements is unauthorized and subject to penalties under the HIA.

Key Rules

- Never access Netcare out of curiosity, convenience, or expedience, or if the individual is not a patient.
- Consent alone does not authorize access without a current care relationship and a legally permitted purpose.
- Never share Netcare credentials or use someone else's.

Misuse and Consequences

- All Netcare access is logged and audited.
- Everyone has a right to request a copy of their own Netcare Access Log, a list of who has viewed their Netcare record.
- Suspected misuse may be investigated by custodians, regulatory colleges, the Department, OIPC, or law enforcement.
- Offences may be prosecuted under the HIA and subject to fines up to \$200,000.

For Providers: Is Use Authorized?

If you are wondering if your use of Netcare is authorized, ask yourself

- Is my use authorized by the HIA?
 - For example: Am I providing "health services" as defined in legislation and according to my job description, College's scope of practice, licensing requirements, etc.?
 - o Note, "health services" include preparing for an upcoming appointment.
- Do I need to know the health information I access Netcare?
- Do my employers, College, etc., permit me to treat this person as a patient and in these circumstances?
- Have I provided health services to this person at my place of work and where I am designated to access their Netcare profile?
- Would the person expect me to view their record?



Examples of Unauthorized Access

- Looking up family member's health information (e.g., lab test result):
 - Many health regulatory colleges have established standards that prevent or limit their members from providing health services or medical care to family members.
 - If a Netcare user's regulatory college does not permit members to provide treatment to family members, then a Netcare user who reviews a family member's record has violated Netcare's rules for use.
- Looking up one's own health information:
 - The health regulatory colleges in Alberta are responsible for setting standards of practice for its members including those respecting treating oneself.
 - o Health care providers generally cannot access their own health information in Netcare.

Other Ways to Access Netcare Information

MyHealth Records (MHR) provides Albertans access to some of their health information available via Netcare to help them manage their health.

Albertans can make an access request for Netcare records from a custodian with whom there is a current care relationship and who has access to Netcare.
